Welcome to the third edition of the Longdon Parish Council News, this newsletter summarises the main points discussed at the Parish Council Meeting on Tuesday 9th September 2014.

1. Public Participation

Mr Michael Neill of Mill Way, Longdon expressed his dissatisfaction with changes in the timing of the bus service. He emphasised that a major risk caused by the changes is that it was impossible to access the Health Centre in Rugeley. His complaints to the Staffordshire Traffic Commissioner had produced no action. The Council raised the matter later with Councillor Martin Titley of the County Council who agreed to look into it further once all the details were communicated to him. Councillor Richard Clarke welcomed Mr Neill's contribution and stressed that he wanted to encourage parishioners to use the Parish Council as much as possible in dealing with their worries and concerns.

2. Highways and Open Spaces (HOS) Issues

- The Chairman of the Committee, Councillor Steve Welch, stressed that a particularly good summer had led to overgrown hedges which were blocking pavements, footpaths and lanes throughout the Parish. He asked for the help of all householders and landowners to ensure that hedges were cut back where necessary.
- The Committee recommended to the Council that Lower Way, Upper Longdon, needed overgrown hedges cut back immediately for safety reasons. The Council agreed to pay for this work to be done as soon as possible.
- The Council needs volunteers to support our environmental work. If you are interested contact the Clerk to the Parish Council.

3. Parish Handyman
